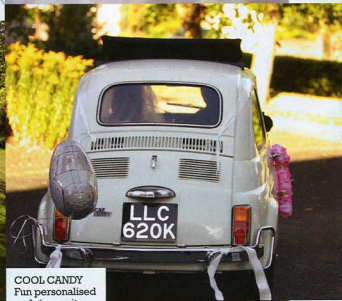
accepted with, 'Of course I will, you muppet!' and in a delirious state we walked back to the hotel for champagne to celebrate."

The outfits

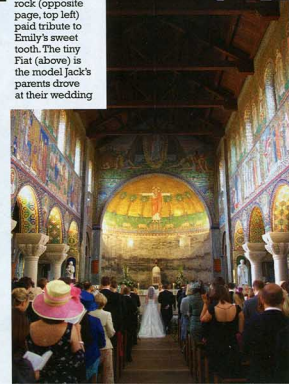

Tables were named after retro sweets and Emily's sister made a seating plan on coloured ribbons from VV Rouleaux, attaching names with double-sided tape. Guests' naughty cravings were satisfied with glass jars of penny sweets and yummy personalised sticks of rock.

Decorations to delight

Emily wanted her wedding to look "magical and whimsical" and used soft shades of pink, green and white. She carried a bouquet of orchids and adorned the venue with roses, hydrangeas, agapanthus and chrysanthemums. Birdcages containing faux roses, butterflies and white doves were hung above the white picket fence, while Jack sourced giant disco balls from Ryness to suspend from the ceiling.
